On this day, children carefully buy or craft red carnations out of colorful paper. They attach a small ribbon, sometimes with a heartfelt note that simply says, "Thank you," and gently pin the flower on their parents' chest. Parents wear it all day, smiling warmly, their hearts full from that simple but meaningful gesture. Just one little flower can brighten their entire day. When I was young, I would make paper carnations each year and write my message of thanks. Before heading off to school, I would pin them onto my mother and father's chest. I still remember their joyful smiles and the way they lovingly patted my head a little more tenderly on that day. Now, I can no longer place that flower on my parents' chest. But their love lives on in me. Even when words were few, they prayed for me, quietly supported me, and most of all, loved me without wavering. That steady love has become the firm foundation of my life.

And now, it is my turn to pass that love on—to my children and to everyone I meet. Gratitude is not meant to stay hidden in the heart; it is a gift that longs to be shared through the way we live. So once again, I remind myself to live with love, with gratitude, and with blessing.

The Bible says, "Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving

you." (Exodus 20:12) Honoring our parents is not just about manners or duty; it's a reflection of a life shaped by God's love. When we remember the love we've received and choose to share it forward, our lives become richer, filled with God's grace.

This May, who would you like to offer a carnation to? Or in what ways might you express a gratitude that cannot be captured in a single flower? May this month be a time of remembering love and letting our thankfulness shine through in how we live.



For the month of May, Good Shepherd will be collecting cereal boxes because the children love picking out their own cereal at the food banks. Any type of cereal, and any size box are accepted.


Food For Hope recently conducted a survey of families they serve and below is one result.

Please bring a snack to share, and drinks will be provided.




Stephen Ministry
