


The Shepherd Methodist Church because...

The Evening Circle of the Woman's Society of Christian Service was organized in the Fall of 1949 wth Mrs. Lyle Bryant-President, Mrs. Beulah (Hazelton) Piatt-Vice President, Mrs. George Rabb-Recording Secretary, Mrs. Robert Adams-Promotion Secretary, Mrs. Joe Flynn-Treasurer, Mrs. Harry Brattin Jr.-Secretary of Spiritual Life. The Evening Circle was reorganized in September 1950 into the Wesleyn Service Guild, a Little Sister of the W.S.C.S.

The purpose of the Guild is to provide a channel through which employed women and mothers with young children may participate in a program offering spiritual enrichment, christian fellowship and the opportunity to take an active part in developing a world christian community. At the present time there are twenty-seven members in the Guild.

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
