

Going back to....1957



Reverend Ostrom Dies at 93 in Carson City

The Reverend Charles P. Osom of Shepherd, the oldest Methodist minister in Michigan, died last night at the Carson City Hospital. He was 93 years old.

Funeral services will be Thursday, August 13 at 2 p.m. in the Shepherd Methodist Church. Burial will be at the Riverside Cemetery in Mt. Pleasant. Friends may call at the Garber Funeral Home in Shepherd.

Born in Okemos, on February 2, 1871, Rev. Ostrom was an evangelist for 12 years before joining the Methodist Conference in 1904.

On June 11 of this year, retired minister Rev. Ostrom, received the Golden Cane from Bishop Marshall Reed for being the oldest Michigan Methodist

He made his home at 117 E. Maple in Shepherd. He is survived by five daughters: Mrs. Betty Pregel of Orlando, Fla., Mrs. Ruth McArthur of Shepherd, Mrs. Dee Allen of Maple Rapids, Mrs. Russell Allswede of Mt. Pleasant and Mrs. Max Elliott of St. Johns; a stepdaughter Mrs. Olan Gorby of Sand Lake; 10 grandchildren; 30 great grandchildren and seven great great grandchildren.
